- Water Department:
  - Lead & Copper Rule Malnory stated that this is a heavy subject with the DNR. There is a lot of legislature that would like to take the homeowners with lead lines to their homes and have the City fund the replacement of those lines to plastic and then have the homeowner pay back like they do sewer hook-ups over time. Malnory also stated that the City has about 130 lines that would need to be replaced at a cost of about \$1,700 to the homeowner.
