SUBJECT: An Ordinance Amending Zoning Code Related To River Frontage Setback

In September, a resident inquired about building within 40 feet of the Fox River and currently 82-25 allows U.S. Corps of Engineers and Wisconsin DNR to grant exceptions. I reached out to both agencies and they do not have the authority to grant those exceptions and advised the City to amend the ordinance. As I was discussing the changes with the DNR, the noticed the shoreland zoning ordinance was inaccurate as well. NR 117 and Wisconsin Act 80 in 2013 that pertaining to annexed properties in cities. One of the changes includes land that was annexed after May 1, 1982 must have a 50 foot setback from the ordinary high-water mark. Some of the other items is referencing the accurate state statue and adding a resource of the Wisconsin Wetland Inventory from the DNR. The DNR reviewed the ordinance and approved as presented.

Recommendation: Accept the Plan Commissions recommendation to approve an ordinance amending zoning code related to river frontage setback.

ORDINANCE #01-20

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ZONING CODE RELATED TO RIVER FRONTAGE SETBACK

WHEREAS, the City of Berlin Plan Commission has held a public hearing regarding the ordinance change, as set forth herein, on December 23, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has recommended to the Common Council for approval of the ordinance change, as set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, the Common Council of the City of Berlin do ordain as follows:

Sec. 82-25 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Berlin is hereby repealed and restated as follows:

Sec. 82-25. - River frontage setback.

(1) Definitions. The following terms or words used in this section mean:

Boathouse means a permanent structure used for the storage of watercraft and associated materials and includes all structures which are totally enclosed, have roofs or walls, or any combination of these structural parts.

Footprint means the land covered by a structure at ground level measured on a horizontal plane. The footprint of a structure includes the horizontal plane bounded by the furthest exterior wall and eave, if present, projected to natural grade. For structures without walls (decks, stairways, patios, carports) having a single-horizontal plane, the footprint is bounded by the furthest portion of the structure projected to natural grade.

Note: For the purposes of replacing or reconstructing a nonconforming building with walls, the footprint shall not be expanded by enclosing the area that is located within the horizontal plane from the exterior wall to the eaves projected to natural grade.

Ordinary high-water mark means the point on the bank or shore up to which the presence and action of surface water is so continuous as to leave a distinctive mark such as by erosion, destruction, or prevention of terrestrial vegetation, predominance of aquatic vegetation, or other easily recognized characteristics. Determinations of navigability and ordinary high-water mark location shall made by the zoning administrator.

- (2) Setback. Unless exempt under section 82-25(1)(a), a setback of 40 feet for R-1 and R-2 districts and 10 feet for other zoning districts from the ordinary high-water mark of the Fox River to the nearest part of a building or structure shall be required for all buildings and structures.
 - (a) Exempt structures. All of the following structures are exempt from the river frontage setback in section 82.25(2), so long as they are otherwise in compliance with

floodplain zoning standards in chapter 82, article VI and shoreland wetland standards in chapter 82, article VIII:

- 1. Boathouses located entirely above the ordinary high-water mark that do not contain plumbing and are not used for human habitation.
 - a. The construction or placement of boathouses below the ordinary high-water mark of any navigable waters shall be prohibited.
 - b. Boathouses shall be designed and constructed solely for the storage of boats and related equipment.
 - c. One boathouse is permitted on a lot or parcel as an accessory structure.
 - d. Boathouses constructed where the existing slope is more than 50% shall be designed to not destabilize the existing slope. Final grades must be at a slope that is naturally stable, depending on soil type.
 - e. Boathouses shall be one story with sidewalls not exceeding 10 feet in height and a footprint not to exceed 16 feet in width by 24 feet in depth.

Boathouse roofs shall be designed with a pitched roof having a maximum slope of 4/12 and in no case shall be designed for use as a deck, observation platform, or for other similar uses.

- g. Earth-toned color shall be required for all exterior surfaces of a boathouse.
- h. The main door shall face the water.
- i. Patio doors, fireplaces, and other features, inconsistent with the use of the structure exclusively as a boathouse, are not permitted.
- 2. Broadcast signal receivers, including satellite dishes or antennas that are one meter or less in diameter and satellite earth station antennas that are two meters or less in diameter.
- 3. Utility transmission and distribution lines, poles, towers, water towers, pumping stations, well pump house covers, private on site wastewater treatment systems that comply with Ch. SPS Comm 383, and other utility structures that have no feasible alternative location outside of the minimum setback and that employ best management practices to infiltrate or otherwise control stormwater runoff from the structure.

- 4. Walkways, stairways or rail systems that are necessary to provide pedestrian access to the shoreline and are a maximum of 60 inches in width.
- 5. In cases of steep slopes, a rail system (i.e., tram or lift) in addition to a stairway, shall be permitted as long as the rail system is mounted to or immediately adjacent to the existing stairway.
- 6. Devices or systems used to treat runoff from impervious surfaces.
- (b) Existing Exempt Structures. Existing exempt structures in violation of the river frontage setback in section 82.25(2) may be maintained, repaired, replaced, restored, rebuilt, and remodeled provided the activity does not expand the footprint and does not go beyond the three-dimensional building envelope of the existing structure, and so long such is activity is otherwise in compliance with floodplain zoning standards in chapter 82, article VI and shoreland-wetland standards in chapter 82, article VIII. The expansion of a structure beyond the existing footprint may be permitted if the expansion is necessary to comply with applicable state and federal requirements.

This ordinance shall take effect the day after publication.

The numeric section numbers and headings of any portions of the Code of Ordinances affected by this Ordinance shall be subject to modification in the discretion of the codifier, and the approval of the City Attorney, during codification into the City's current Code of Ordinances.

SUBJECT: Amendment to New Home Incentive Program for 2020

Background:

At the budget workshop, the Committee of the Whole discussed amending the residential new home incentive program for 2020. Attached is the layout of the program. The program will be reviewed annually during the budget approval process.

Recommendation: Accept the Committee of the Whole recommendation to approve the amendment to new home incentive program for 2020.

2020 City of Berlin Residential New Home Incentive Program

<u>Purpose</u>: The purpose is to encourage residential development by providing financial incentives to developers and builders of residential housing within the City of Berlin. The program is specifically designed to encourage single family/duplex & multi-family construction projects, and therefore increase the tax base in an accelerated fashion, increase the available high quality housing stock in the community and, reduce blighted residential areas of the city.

<u>Program Design:</u> The City of Berlin is offering an incentive payment of 4% based on the assessed valuation of a new home which are constructed within the city limits. It applies to new residential construction and not to additions, remodeling, or construction of accessory buildings. The incentive payment is based on the increased improvement value (land value not included) as determined by the City of Berlin Tax Assessor. The incentive payment is awarded when an occupancy permit is obtained from the Building Inspector. Maximum amount of the incentive payment is \$5,000 per property. Increases due to reassessment or revaluation of existing improvements are not eligible for incentive payment under the program. If the property has a special assessment against it, it must be paid prior to the payment of the incentive payment.

<u>Housing Task Force Incentive Program:</u> Shown below are various assessed values utilizing the 4% incentive payment which is recommended by the Housing Task Force.

- 1) The incentive payment will be applied to any new residential construction.
- 2) The incentive payment does not apply to additions, remodeling, or construction of accessory buildings.
- 3) The incentive payment will be awarded when an occupancy permit is obtained from the Building Inspector.
- 4) Any new residential permits obtained after 1/1/2013 will be eligible for the incentive payment, subject to funding availability as described below.
- 5) The incentive payment will be calculated on the improvement value only (not land value).
- 6) The incentive payment will be based on the full assessment value placed on the home as determined by the City Tax Assessor
- 7) Maximum amount of the incentive payment is \$5,000 per parcel.
- 8) The program funds for 2020 are budgeted at \$65,000 and incentive payments are awarded on a first come first serve basis based on the date of occupancy permit issuance. If budgeted funds are exhausted, additional funding must be requested from the Common Council. The program will be reviewed annually during the budget approval process.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A MUNICIPAL COURT

The Common Council of the City of Berlin do ordain as follows:

Ordinance 9-19, adopted by the Common Council on December 10, 2019, is hereby repealed and replaced with the following:

Section 1-19(a) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Berlin shall be repealed and recreated as follows:

Sec. 1-19. - Municipal Court

(a) Municipal Court Created

Court Established: Pursuant to the authority granted by § 755.01(4), Wis. Stats., or as subsequently amended, there is hereby created and established a Municipal Court to be designated "Lakeside Municipal Court," serving the cities of Fond du Lac and Ripon, villages of Brandon, Campbellsport, Fairwater, North Fond du Lac, and Oakfield and the towns of Empire, Osceola, Ripon, Taycheedah and Oakfield in Fond du Lac County, the City of Berlin in Green Lake and Waushara counties, the cities of Green Lake, Markesan and Princeton in Green Lake County, and any other local governmental unit which adopts a similar version of this chapter as a member of the Lakeside Municipal Court. Said Court shall become operative and functional after the member of the Lakeside Municipal Court passes a version of the ordinance described in this section.

All remaining subsections of Sec. 1-19 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Berlin shall remain in full force and effect.

Upon publication, this ordinance shall be effective retroactively to January 1, 2020.

The numeric section numbers and headings shall be subject to modification in the discretion of the codifier, and the approval of the City Attorney, during codification into the city's current Code of Ordinances.

There has been minimal progress on the property for the exterior siding and now we are past the deadline for the roof repairs too.
