- S. Swetting St. (Junction St. to Ripon Rd.) No utility work is being done in this section of roadway. The existing pavement will be full depth milled and repaved, spot curb & gutter repairs and manhole adjustments.
- Jackson St. (Broadway St. to Webster St.) The existing pavement will be full depth milled and repaved, spot curb & gutter repairs. No utility work is slated to be done in this section of roadway; however, if special field work adjustments are necessary for sanitary or water laterals, property owners would notified.
- Jefferson St. (Broadway St. to Webster St.) The existing pavement will be full depth milled and repaved, spot curb & gutter repairs. No utility work is slated to be done

in this section of roadway; however, if special field work adjustments are necessary for sanitary or water laterals, property owners would notified.

At this point in time, the project is tentatively slated to begin in May 2020 and is anticipated to be completed and open to traffic, with the exception of the final course of asphalt, in or around October 2020. The final course of asphalt will be placed in 2021, but this process will only take a few days and should not cause any traffic concerns or major inconveniences. During the 2020 construction period, the road will be open to local and emergency traffic, so you will have access to your homes.

On March 10, 2020, the Common Council adopted a preliminary resolution declaring the intent to levy special assessments for the project. The in person public informational meeting on March 18, 2020, was cancelled due to COVID-19 but residents were notified that plans and preliminary assessments were made available at city hall or on the city website www.cityofberlin.net on the Home page under "Latest News" as well as staff being available to answer individual question by phone or one on one at City Hall.

The next step is to hold a public hearing at the April 14, 2020 7:00 p.m. Common Council meeting to receive public input. Due to COVID-19 the Common Council is holding meetings via web video/teleconferencing utilizing ZOOM.

Enclosed you will find copies of the Preliminary Resolution, Public Hearing notice published in the Berlin Journal, and the preliminary special assessments listing by affected parcel. Below are some important notes to remember regarding special assessments:

- ASSESSMENT BILLING AMOUNTS: The final special assessment billings may be less than the preliminary amounts because the final figures are based on *actual costs* determined in the field during the construction phase.
 - O Sewer Laterals: The sewer lateral costs included in the report are shown at the maximum you would have to pay based on the 2020 Standardized Special Assessment Schedule, which is \$1,808 per sewer lateral. Although we need to inform you of the worst case scenario maximum cost, it is likely your cost will be less after the bidding process and construction is completed.
 - o Water Laterals: Water laterals will be replaced from the new watermain to the property line, but will *not* be assessed to the property owners.
 - o Private Lead Water Service Laterals (portion of lateral extending from property line to meter): Lead service laterals that are identified prior to or during construction will need to be replaced per city ordinance from property line to meter. Either the property owner can contract privately with a contractor or elect to have a city contractor replace the privately-owned portion of the lead service line.
 - o **Sidewalk/Carriage Walks:** Spot sidewalk and carriage walk replacement along the project will only be replaced where needed. This is a cost shared 50/50 between the property owner and the City. <u>If you do not want your existing carriage walk replaced, please contact the Street Superintendent at 361-5425.</u>
- TIMING OF BILLING: Assessments are billed *after* project completion, which will be the fall of 2020.
- INSTALLMENT PAYMENT PLAN: Although assessments can be paid in full upon initial billing, the City does offer an installment payment plan. For those who wish to pay by the installment plan, the first payment would be due on or before Nov 1, 2020.
 - Sewer laterals can be financed for up to 10 years at 7% interest, with a minimum annual installment payment of \$200. For example, based on \$1,808 for a sewer lateral, the annual installment payment would be approximately \$257 for 10 years.
 - o Private Lead Water Service Laterals (portion of lateral extending from property line to meter): This cost is the property owner's responsibility; however, the City will work with homeowners on an assessment payment plan similar to that of sewer lateral assessments.
 - o Sidewalks/carriage walks are also eligible for a payment deferral plan, but only if the annual payment would be over \$500.00. Due to no sidewalk replacement and the limited carriage walk replacement on this project, it not anticipated that any property owner would qualify for the installment plan.

Installation of sewer laterals on the following streets as shown on the accompanying maps:

Install, repair, and replace sidewalks as necessary on the following streets, the specific extent of such improvements to be determined and included in the City Engineer's report referenced in paragraph 5 below:

2. The property to be assessed lies within the following described assessment district:

ASSESSMENT DISTRICT

3. Before the water & sewer main replacements are made, the Utility Superintendent shall cause water & sewer service laterals to be laid in the street from the water & sewer

mains to the lot line of each lot fronting on the street and shall cause the amount charged to each lot for the sewer lateral only shall be entered on the tax roll as a special tax against each lot. The amount charged for said lateral shall be based upon the Housing Task Force Standardized Special Assessment Schedule for the replacement of sewer lateral, as approved by the Common Council, based upon 2020 rates, as long as the lateral is for standard service, but shall in no case exceed 100% of the total cost of the improvements. If larger service is required, the actual cost for the installation of the lateral for said lot shall be accounted for and charged to said lot and entered on the tax roll as a special tax on said lot.

In regard to the sidewalk installation, repairs, and replacements, the Street Superintendent shall keep an accurate account of the expenses incurred in front of each lot and shall report these costs to the city clerk who shall, pursuant to city ordinance relating to sidewalk replacement, cause ½ of such expense for each applicable lot to be entered on the tax roll as a special tax against the lot. In no case shall the amount assessed to a lot be more than 50% of the total cost of the sidewalk improvements benefiting the lot.

- 4. The Common Council determines that the improvements constitute an exercise of the police power for the health, safety and general welfare of the City of Berlin and its inhabitants.
- 5. The City Engineer shall prepare a report which shall consist of:
 - a. Preliminary plans and specifications for the improvements.
 - b. An estimate of the entire cost of the proposed improvements.
 - c. Schedule of proposed assessments.
- 6. When the report is completed, the City Engineer shall file a copy of the report with the City Clerk for public inspection and, if state property is to be assessed, shall mail a copy of the report to the responsible state agency and, for assessments of \$50,000.00 or more, to the Wisconsin State Building Commission.
- 7. Upon receiving the report of the City Engineer, the City Clerk shall cause notice to be given stating the nature of the proposed improvements, the general boundary lines of the proposed assessment district (including a small map thereof), the time and place at which the report may be inspected, and the time and place of the public hearing on the matters contained in the preliminary resolution and the report. This notice shall be published as a Class I Notice under Chapter 985, Stats., and a copy shall be mailed, at least ten (10) days before the hearing, to every interested party whose address is known or can be ascertained with reasonable diligence.
- 8. The hearing shall be held in the City Hall Council Chambers at 108 N. Capron St., Berlin, WI 54923 at a time set by the City Clerk in accordance with Wis. Statutes §66.0703 (7).
- 9. The assessment against any parcel may be paid in cash or in annual installments, the number of which shall be determined at the public hearing on the proposed assessments.



RE: Discussion on Proposed Updates to City Ordinances Related to Keeping of Chickens

<u>BACKGROUND</u>: At the March meeting, Andi Rogers approached Council requesting discussion be held on modifications to the ordinances pertaining to keeping of chickens. Andi provided an outline of the proposed changes. I have also included a copy of the current ordinances for your reference.

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> 1) Waive Committee of the Whole discussion on this issue and 2) Review request, discuss and action as appropriate.

Proposed edits and possible additions to the Berlin City Chicken ordinances

- Section 10-21 (c) (2) c. 1. Suggest the removal of the word insulated. Chickens do not require
 insulation nor a heat source to stay warm even in Wisconsin winters. A draft free, well
 ventilated environment that reduces humidity is what is needed. The frostbite from high
 humidity is what will hurt the birds. Chickens 'poof' up their down feathers and trap warm air
 next to their skin. Since the avg body temperature of a chicken is 105-107 degrees... this is how
 they stay warm.
- Section 10-21 (d) (3) Suggest adjusting the number of nesting boxes from 1 per 2 birds to 1 per 4 birds. Also suggest that the coop space per bird be defined by bird size. Standard chickens require more room than Bantam chickens (which are popularly kept as backyard chickens)
 - a. Minimum 7 sq ft or 3 sq ft per standard chicken/2 sq ft per bantam chicken whichever is greater.
- 3. Section 82-286 (8) In regards to the number of birds allowed see narrative below:

I have been keeping chickens since 2017 when the ordinance was first passed, and I decided to be a 'backyard farmer' so that I could provide the family with fresh eggs. I do not keep chickens as a novelty or as pets. Even though mine are spoiled; egg production sustainability is my focus. I am asking council to consider increasing the number of allowed hens based on information I have learned about their egg production habits.

A few things I have learned over the last 3 years:

- 1. It takes time to identify a newly hatched bird as a male or a female.
 - a. 6-8 weeks visual differences are beginning to be noticeable
 - b. 4-5 months for a rooster to crow which is almost always the tell tale sign (tho some hens DO crow)
- 2. It takes 6-9 months for a newly hatched pullet to begin laying
 - a. A pullet is a female chicken that hasn't laid an egg yet.
- 3. Many chicken owners suggest having a flock of both Spring AND Fall hatches to keep consistent egg production.
- 4. Newly hatched birds are often sold 6 at a time at places like Tractor Supply
 - a. Many are straight run, which means they are NOT sexed so you won't know if male or female for the above time. This is the more affordable/reasonable option.
 - b. Guaranteed pullets are harder to find and often cost 400% or more per bird than straight run.
- 5. Hens can lay eggs up to 7 years or more, but they decrease egg production as they get older starting at 3-5 years. This means that having chickens of different ages is important to sustain egg production longevity.

With these things in mind I would like to propose the following:

- 1. With the appropriate coop space, properly licensed owners be allowed
 - a. Up to 10 standard hens or,
 - b. Up to 12 bantam hens
 - c. (a hen is defined as a female chicken that has started laying eggs)
- 2. I propose that licensing fees increase with the number of birds
 - a. 6 standard/8 bantam \$10 per yr
 - b. 8 standard/10 bantam \$15 per yr
 - c. 10 standard/12 bantam \$20 per yr
- 3. When a Backyard Farmer needs to plan the rotation of their flock that they be allowed to obtain extra chicks and given the time to raise them to new chicks to maturity to determine if they are roosters or pullets, with the requirement that any hens over the limit or birds that are male will have to be removed.

Sec. 10-21. - Proper shelter.

- (a) Required. No person owning or responsible for confining or impounding an animal within the city shall fail to provide the animal with proper shelter as set forth in this section. In the case of farm animals, nothing in this section shall be construed as imposing shelter requirements or standards more stringent than normally accepted husbandry practices in the particular county where the animal or shelter is located.
- (b) Indoor standards. Minimum indoor standards of shelter shall include:
 - (1) The ambient temperature shall be compatible with the health of the animal.
 - (2) Indoor housing facilities shall be adequately ventilated by natural or mechanical means to provide for the health of the animals at all times.
- (c) Outdoor standards. Minimum outdoor standards of shelter shall include:
 - (1) For all animals tied or confined unattended outdoors during the months of April through October, sufficient shade by natural or artificial means shall be provided to protect animals from direct sunlight.
 - (2) Shelter shall be provided from inclement weather as follows:
 - a. Natural or artificial shelter appropriate to the local climatic conditions for the species concerned shall be provided as necessary for the health of the animal.
 - b. If a dog is tied or confined unattended outdoors, or in an unheated enclosure, a shelter of suitable size to accommodate the dog shall be provided. At a minimum, the shelter shall:
 - 1. Be a moisture-proof, weathertight doghouse which shall be maintained in good repair;
 - 2. Be constructed and maintained so as to provide sufficient space to:
 - i. Allow the dog to turn around freely;
 - ii. Allow the dog to easily sit, stand and lie in a normal position;
 - iii. Keep the dog clean, dry and comfortable; and
 - iv. Maintain the dog's body heat.
 - 3. Made of durable materials including, but not limited to, wood or molded plastic;
 - 4. Have an entrance covered by a self-closing swinging door or covering, or an U-shaped entrance to prevent the wind and elements from blowing directly into the shelter;
 - 5. Have clean bedding to provide insulation and protection against cold and dampness, and promote the retention of body heat. Acceptable bedding shall include, but not be limited to, blankets, hay, straw or cedar shavings;

- 6. Have suitable drainage, which rapidly eliminates excess water.
- c. If a chicken enclosure is outdoors, at a minimum, the enclosure shall:
 - 1. Be enclosed, predator-proof, insulated, and adequately ventilated;
 - 2. Be so constructed and maintained as to prevent rodents from being harbored underneath or within the walls thereof;
 - 3. Provide elevated perches to ensure chickens are able to rest in their natural roosting position;
 - 4. Not be located closer than ten feet from an adjacent property owner's lot line, not be located closer than 25 feet to any primary residential structure on an adjacent lot, and must be located in the rear yard of the property as defined by section 82-4A. The structure must also meet detached accessory buildings/structures requirements, as regulated by section 82-553A.
 - 5. Chickens shall be secured within the enclosure during non-daylight hours.
 - 6. In addition to an enclosure, chickens shall be provided access to an outdoor enclosed run area for the majority of daylight hours, weather permitting.
- (d) *Space standards.* Minimum space requirements for both indoor and outdoor animal enclosures shall include:
 - (1) The housing facilities shall be structurally sound and maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury, and to contain the animals.
 - (2) Enclosures shall be constructed and maintained so as to provide sufficient space to allow each animal adequate freedom of movement. Inadequate space may be indicated by evidence of debility, stress or abnormal behavior patterns.
 - (3) Chicken enclosures shall measure a minimum of seven square feet in area or three square feet in area per chicken, whichever is greater, with one nest box provided per every two chickens.
- (e) Sanitation standards. All pens, yards, structures or areas where animals are kept shall be maintained in a nuisance-free manner. Droppings and manure shall be removed regularly and disposed of properly to not attract insects or rodents, become unsightly or cause objectionable odors. Further, for all pens, yards, structures or areas, where animals other than chickens are kept, installed or set up after May 1, 2002, no portion of the pen, yard, structure or area may be closer than six feet from a neighboring property owner's lot line.
- (f) Tying or tethering dogs. A dog or puppy may be restrained by a fixed-point chain or tether only under the following conditions:
 - (1) Any tethering system shall not allow the dog or puppy to leave the owner's property.
 - (2) No chain or tether shall weigh more than one-eighth of the dog's or puppy's body weight.





describe" the premises because a broad description is not statutorily prohibited. Wisconsin Dolls, LLC v. Town of Dell Prairie, 2012 WI 76. But a municipality is not required to accept a broad premises description on initial application and permit activity in such an area. Id. A municipality may attach conditions, including limitations to the described premises, when the license is initially granted. Id.

- b. Any questions about the extent of the described premises should be clarified with the applicant before the license is granted.
- c. The municipal official must issue the license with a premises description identical to that shown on the application and approved by the governing body.
 - Changing the description
- a. If the request is made for a new license year, the applicant may add to the description on the application any change from the previous year.
- b. For any revision during the license year, the licensee must file a written request with the municipal official to amend the premises description. It is within the discretion of the governing body to approve or disapprove the change. Albertly. City of Whitewater, 109 Wis.2d 592, 327 N.W.2d 150 (1982). See also Wis. Stat. sec. 125.04(3)(h).
- c. If the change is approved, the municipal official must amend the license and the license must be posted on the premises.
- d. Premises modifications after initial issuance, especially those that disadvantage the licensee, must be accomplished by enactment of a valid local regulation under. Wis. Stat. sec. 125.10(1), by following the procedures outlined in sec. 125.12 for revocation, suspension or renewal, or by negotiating the consent of the licensee. A municipality that unilaterally reduces the description of the premises on a renewal exceeds its authority. Wisconsin Dolls, LLC v. Town of Dell Prairie, 2012 WI 76.
 - 3. Use of street address to describe the premises
 - a. Use of a city or village street address is possible only if the applicant has been granted a license to cover the entire location: i.e., the building(s) and land area at that address.

If the license is to cover the building or a part of the building only, then the applicant must describe the building or portion of the building at the appropriate street address as shown on the license application.

b. If an applicant has a town address that pinpoints the location of the premises, the same procedure would be followed as above.

The use of a route number, a highway number (or the legal description) in itself does not properly identify the area under the control of the applicant where the alcohol beverages will be sold, served, consumed, or stored.

- 4. Exterior sale, service, or consumption
 Sale, service, or consumption of alcohol beverages outside the barroom is
 permissible only if the area in question (e.g., a porch, outdoor volleyball court, terrace, "beer garden" or lawn area) is described in the license as being part of the licensed premises.
 - Effect of premises loss on license
- a. The licensee may: (1) hold the license until its expiration date, (2) request approval of the governing body on form AT-112 to transfer the license to another location in the municipality, or (3) surrender the license to the municipal clerk. An alcohol

Dear Midge,

You are aware that Quarles & Brady serves as legal counsel for Walmart with respect to alcohol beverage licensing for its Wisconsin stores. As follow-up to our telephone conversation this morning, this email is to provide you with details regarding an online grocery pickup service that Walmart is launching in select Wisconsin stores. Customers using this service will be able to place an order online and provide a credit card to hold the order. The customer will then come to their local Walmart store to complete the payment and pick up the order at either a pickup canopy or a dedicated parking space.

Walmart would like to offer their customers in your community the opportunity to include alcohol beverages in an online order. We have contacted the Department of Revenue, which has confirmed that this is permitted under Wisconsin law provided payment is made at the time of pickup and the customer's age is verified by an employee licensed to sell alcohol beverages in a face-to-face transaction that occurs within the licensed premises. Walmart, therefore, is seeking to amend the premises description in its current license to include the pickup location (canopy or dedicated parking spaces), as follows:

1 room 1 story, approximately 102,773 sq. ft. including stalls and/or canopy locations in parking lot specifically designated for online grocery pickup.

Attached to this email are the following documents which provide more detailed information about the online grocery program:

- A copy of Walmart's Online Grocery Pickup Procedure Guide.
- A combination floor plan and site map of the local Walmart store that show (i) the secure area in the store where shopping carts will be held for
 customer pickup (highlighted in orange) and (ii) the location in the parking lot of the canopy or dedicated parking spaces which will be designated for
 online grocery pickup.

Walmart would like to roll-out their online grocery pickup service in the City of Berlin in early April. Please let us know whether this change of premises description will require approval of the Berlin City Council and/or Committee thereof. If so, we kindly request that the proposed amendment be considered at their next upcoming meeting. Also, we would be pleased to make a representative from the local Walmart store available at such meetings to answer any questions raised by the City officials.

Placing Order

- Customers visit grocery.walmart.com and can view an assortment of products determined by their store
 - Listed products are initially based on the Customer's location and updated when the Customer selects their preferred store
- Prior to checking out, the Customer must login (or create) their account, select a desired pickup store, and designate a time slot for picking up their order
- Once the customer has built their basket and presses checkout, Customer completes the order by supplying Walmart with payment information
- Walmart authorizes and holds the card information, but funds are not transferred from the



- Where allowed by state and local law, customers can include alcoholic beverage product in their online grocery order through walmart.com/grocery.
- All alcoholic beverage product item pages are flagged with a notification explaining the restrictions around purchasing this product (pictured below).

Picking / Staging

- On the day a customer is scheduled to pick up an order, a Walmart associate known as a "Personal Shopper" will "shop" for the customer's order in the store
- All shopping is completed on the pickup day to ensure the Customer receives the freshest products
- If a product is not available in-store, it is either substituted or removed from the customer's
 - Alcohol beverage products are never substituted if they are not available in-store, they are removed from the customer's order and the customer is not charged



- Alcohol beverage products are assigned to a "Restricted" commodity group to ensure only Personal Shoppers who have received appropriate training and are of a legal age – per the governing jurisdiction – will be allowed to pick these products
 - In Wisconsin, Personal Shoppers must hold an operator/bartender license issued by their local municipality
- The picking carts used by our Personal Shoppers "shop" for Customers – are equipped with a roll of stickers labeled with the word "alcohol"
 - Orders containing alcohol beverage products are bagged and labeled with an alcohol sticker (pictured right)
 - This sticker enables our Personal Shoppers to clearly identify items that are subject to additional regulatory restrictions
- All picked orders are kept in a secure backroom staging area, not open to the public, and only where Walmart employees are permitted to enter

Customer Pickup: Order Review

- Online Grocery Pickup is currently offered between 8am 8pm (to better serve our customers, select locations offer additional time slots), 7 days a week (except holidays or other store closures)
- When the customer arrives, they "check-in" via the store's offered methods (phone, app-based, kiosk, options vary by location)
- The Personal Shopper assigned to dispense the order uses the handheld device to identify the order number and pull the appropriate totes from the staging areas
- Prior to putting the customer's order in their vehicle, the Personal Shopper uses their handheld device to review the order with the customer – reviewing substituted items, fragile items, out of stock items, and completing age verification (as needed, based on products in the order)
- This review allows the Customer to ensure they are getting what they want and provides the Customer an opportunity to return or reject any item(s)
- Only Personal Shoppers meeting the age requirements within the governing jurisdiction are allowed to handle and/or dispense orders with alcohol beverage products
- If a Customer's order includes alcohol beverage product, the personal shopper is prompted by their handheld device that there are restricted items in their order
- If alcohol is not allowed to be sold at the time of dispense, the associate
 is notified (via their handheld device) that sale of the product is currently
 restricted, the items are automatically removed from the customer's
 digital basket (the customer will not be charged), and the personal
 shopper will remove the physical product from the order (pictured right)
- The personal shopper will request valid identification as described in our alcohol disclosure – and enter the customer's date of birth from the provided identification into their handheld device (pictured below)









After age verification:

- If the customer is confirmed over 21, the customer can sign for the order, and the personal shopper can place the final order into the customer's vehicle
- If the customer is under 21 and/or cannot provide a valid ID, the alcohol beverage products are removed from the customer's order and the customer is not charged for these products.




Customer Pickup: Dispensing

- Once the customer and personal shopper have:
 - o Reviewed any substituted items, fragile items, and out of stock items
 - o Removed any rejected products that the customer no longer wants
 - Verified the customer's age and identification if the order contained any age restricted items (and if necessary, removed age restricted items)
- The customer signs for the order, the customer's account is charged with the final order amount (after removing the cost of any products removed from the customer's order)
- The personal shopper places the all approved products into the customer's vehicle, and the transaction is considered complete

Background: In 2018, the building inspection fee was updated. As we used the existing fee schedule, we have determined areas that need additional clarification. The proposed changes include:
