Frequently asked questions about our meal program:

1) Why do I have to fill out this form every year?

The forms are not for our records. The Green Lake County Nutrition Program is required to collect new forms from anyone who eats a meal within the program and they must be updated yearly. However, on our end, if we don't turn in the form, we don't get paid by the County for making the meal. I know it is a lot of personal information, but we don't keep the forms at the Senior Center. They are sent immediately to the county.

2) Can I pay a week at a time or do I have to pay each day?

You can pay the suggested donation of \$4 for each meal as you go, or you can pay for a full week or even longer at a time. We accept cash or check. We also have meal punch cards available where we offer 5 meals for \$20.

3) I or someone I know would like to get added to home delivered meals list, what do I do?

In order to be added to our home bound delivery list, you need to contact Green Lake County. The County will determine eligibility. They can be reached at 920-294-4070.

4) Why do I have to call a day ahead now to order a meal?

All the other meal locations in the county require patrons to call the day before, we were lucky to be able to continue the 'same day call in' as long as we could. Now, with food availability concerns and price fluctuations, we have to buy our food much earlier and cannot plan on buying what we need that morning. It is an adjustment, but it makes it much easier and a lot less stressful for our staff.

5) Why are there so many vegetables on the menu?

We are required to meet certain dietary guidelines each day and each week. Our menus must be approved by the county nutritionist. Each day must have at least three total fruits and vegetables. Even if it isn't your favorite, I promise it is full of good nutrients that you need!

6) Will we ever have in house dining again or will it always be carry out?

We are hoping, as COVID becomes a thing of the past, that we will be able to open up for in house dining in the future. We recognize the importance of socialization here at the Senior Center, both with activities and meals, however, part of our responsibility is to also reach as many seniors within our community as we can. Carry out meals reach seniors in our community that otherwise would not be active at the Senior Center. Because of this, we would like to offer both meal options in the future. We are hoping in house meals will be back by Summer.

If you have any questions or concerns that haven't been answered on this page, please give us a call or stop by in the office. We are always happy to explain how our programs work here at the Senior Center.




