BACKGROUND: TIF District #9 River Block is ready to be closed out as it has reached the end of its extended life. The TID began in 1991 to redevelop the river block on the northeast side of the Huron Street bridge. I did certify the TID for one more year which means we can collect one more year of increment (2021 taxes due 2022). The TID will close out with a deficit, which the City of Berlin will have to absorb. With the 2021 tax increment, I anticipate the deficit will be around \$66k.

RESOLUTION #21-08

RESOLUTION TERMINATING TIF DISTRICT #9 AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY TREASURER TO TRANSFER ALL REMAINING DEBTS TO THE MUNICIPALITY

WHEREAS, the City of Berlin passed a creation resolution creating Tax Incremental District No. 9 on August 27, 1991, and adopted a project plan that year; and

WHEREAS, all TIF District No. 9 projects were completed in the prescribed allowed time; and

WHEREAS, insufficient increment has been collected as of the 2021 tax roll, payable 2022, to cover TIF District No. 9 project costs; and

NOW BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the City Common Council does terminate TID District No. 9; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk shall notify the Wisconsin Department of Revenue, within 60 days of this resolution, or prior to the maximum life deadline of August 27, 2021, whichever comes first, that the District has been terminated; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLOVED, that the City Clerk shall sign the required Wisconsin Department of Revenue final accounting form agreeing on a date by which the City shall send final audited information to the Wisconsin Department of Revenue; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Berlin shall accept all remaining debts for TID#9 as determined in the final audit by the City's Auditors, Hawkins, Ashe and Baptie & Company, LLP.

In March the building inspector sent a notice to the property owner regarding the condition of the property and informed the owner that a raze or repair order may be placed on the property if we are not contacted to set up a plan for repairs. We have not received any response from the property owner. When inspecting the property we observed a notice on the front door regarding a possible foreclosure. I reached out to the phone number listed on the paper in the middle of March. When I spoke with the bank I was told repairs would be made in two weeks. I have not seen any progress on the property since making the contact. Since the notice was sent I have received complaints from neighbors regarding potential rodents living in the structure.

Recommendation: Action as appropriate.

The property located at 271 McKittrick Street was vacant at time of inspection.

The following conditions were noted from the exterior of the home:

- The roof of the homes original construction is steel which appears to be weather tight, but has areas of deterioration which require repair or replacement.
- The roof of the addition and the garage is of asphalt shingles and severly deteriorated and requires removal and replacement.
- The roof wall junctures are improperly flashed and must be correctly repaired, with all deteriorated and rotten materials removed and replaced.
- All deteriorated roof framing members (rafters) and sheathing must be replaced.
- No gutters installed on the home and attached garage have caused severe deterioration to the foundation and supporting structure at its perimeter. All rotten and deteriored, structural and non structural components and or materials are to be removed and replaced.
- Deterioration of structural and non structural components have caused uneven setteling and damage. All deteriorated and damaged components must be repaired and or replaced. i.e. foundation walls, floor joist, sill and sole plates, studs, wall sheathing, siding, soffit and fascia, all quire rapair, removal, and or replacement.
- Deteriorated, damaged and broken window and door trim, frames, sashes and panels must be removed and replaced. Windows and doors are currently allowing birds and rodents to enter and nest.
- Vegetation in contact with the roof structures must be removed.
- Vegetation and soil within 8" of structural and or wood components must be removed.
- The chimney is improperly flashed and secured and must be corrected

In conclusion this property has an improvement value of \$18,800 per the 2021 Green Lake County Tax Assessment Data and in my opinion cannot be adequately nor properly repaired for \$9,400 which is fifty percent (50%) of its improved value and thus recommend a Raze Order be issued.

RE: Filing Grant/Loan Applications for Utility Funding for 2021 Water Street & Park Avenue Projects

BACKGROUND:

Staff is pursuing funding opportunities on behalf of the Water & Sewer Utility with the State Clean Water Fund Program (CWFP) and Safe Drinking Water Programs (SDWLP) to help fund the utility portion of the 2021 street projects. The SDWLP application is due June 30, 2021 while the CWFP application is due by September 30, 2021. However, we will submit both in July. These might be long shots, but they are worth a try. The following resolutions are required for the SDWLP and CWFP applications, which are low interest loans with potential for loan forgiveness.

- 1. Authorized Representative Resolution. This Resolution allows the City Administrator to perform all necessary actions related to submission of the SDWLP and CWFP applications.
- Resolution Declaring Official Intent to Reimburse Expenditures from Proceeds of Borrowing for the Safe Drinking Water Loan Program. This Resolution allows the City to reimburse itself for expenditures made for the 2021 Street & Utility Improvements Project prior to receiving loan funds from WDNR.
- 3. Resolution Declaring Official Intent to Reimburse Expenditures from Proceeds of Borrowing for the Clean Water Loan Program. This Resolution allows the City to reimburse itself for expenditures made for the 2021 Street & Utility Improvements Project prior to receiving loan funds from WDNR.

RESOLUTION DECLARING OFFICIAL INTENT TO REIMBURSE EXPENDITURES FROM PROCEEDS OF BORROWING

WHEREAS, the City of Berlin, Green Lake County, Wisconsin, (the 'Municipality') owns and operates a sanitary sewer system (the "System") as a public utility; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality plans to replace sanitary sewer on portions of Water Street, Liberty Street, Berlin Street and Park Avenue and the Municipality intends to apply for a Clean Water Fund Loan (the "Loan") through the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, WDNR Project Nos. 4029-07 and 4029-09; and

WHEREAS, because proceeds from the Clean Water Fund Loan may not be available prior to commencement of construction on the project, the Municipality must provide interim financing to cover costs of the project incurred prior to closing on the Loan; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary, desirable, and in the best interests of the Municipality to advance monies from its funds on hand and reserve balances on an interim basis until Loan proceeds become available,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Berlin, Green Lake County, Wisconsin, that;

WHEREAS, because proceeds from the Safe Drinking Water Fund Loan will not be available prior to commencement of construction on the project, the Municipality must provide interim financing to cover costs of the project incurred prior to closing on the Loan; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary, desirable, and in the best interests of the Municipality to advance monies from its funds on hand and reserve balances on an interim basis until Loan proceeds become available,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Berlin, Green Lake County, Wisconsin, that;
