IMPORTANT INFORMATION

We have a brand new format for the 2022 summer recreation season! No need to worry about childcare options in order to go to a program because we have “stacked” the classes. With this new format, parents, guardians, babysitters, older siblings, and grandparents can drop the children off at their program and then go to the teenaged or adult program.

We also have a brand new way to sign up! We will **NOT** be having a in person sign up day. Instead, we will be using an online based, registration system. With this system, you can sign up for programs whenever is most convenient for you. Payment can also be taken online as well. Just set up an account and register away! Program Information

FEES

Resident and non-resident fees are as listed under course offerings. Registration forms without the proper fee will be returned.

Res = Resident of the City of Berlin. Residential recreation program fees apply to individuals who reside within Berlin City limits with no fire number.

NonRes = Non-Resident. Anyone who lives outside of the City limits.

Note: City residents contribute to the overall funding of the Parks & Recreation Department through residential property taxes.

PAYMENT METHOD

The Parks & Recreation Department encourages payment online immediately after registering for activities. If needed to pay with cash, please contact the Park and Recreation Department.

ENROLLMENT

Enrollment is not guaranteed. We reserve the right to cancel classes because of low enrollment after a class has started and to close further enrollment when a class is filled. All participants must register and pay for classes prior to attending the first session. Consider yourself enrolled for the program unless someone from the Parks and Recreation Department contacts you.

DEADLINES

Registrations must be received before registration deadlines. Registration for each class ends 48 hours before the start date of the class. No telephone registrations accepted. No exceptions.

PARTICIPATION IN PROGRAMS

The department reserves the right to cancel or modify the times, locations, combine classes, change instructors, and/or costs of any program should the need arise. You will not be notified of dates, times, or confirmation of classes. All AGE requirements are as of the first day of the program.

INSURANCE

The City of Berlin does NOT carry individual accident insurance for injuries that may occur while participating in or en-route to any program. Participants should review their insurance policies for coverage.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

Any participant wishing to receive a refund must notify the department before the second scheduled program begins. A full refund will be issued if a program is cancelled. Programs not meeting minimum registration requirements will be cancelled and refunds issued. Program cancellations or modifications due to weather conditions will be announced on the City Website under the Parks and Recreation tab, emailed out via an email blast, and posted as a banner on the recreation website prior to program start time or check with the Parks & Recreation Department at 920-361-5437.
