Notice is hereby given that pursuant to Sec. 70.45 of Wis. Statutes the City of Berlin 2021 assessment rolls for both real and personal property will be open for inspection and to ask questions of the Assessor, on the following day and time:

The **“OPEN BOOK”** session will be **MONDAY, MAY 16th, 2022**, from 1:30 p.m. until 3:30 p.m. Due to COVID-19 precautions, this Open Book will be held by telephone only or via Zoom by request. The assessment roll will be available for public viewing on-line at www.cityofberlin.net on or before May 16. If you wish to schedule a phone or Zoom conference with the assessor, please contact (920) 766-7323. If you have any pertinent data relating to the value of your property (such as recent appraisal, listing contracts, etc.) please share that information with the assessor. If a property owner is not satisfied with his/her assessment after speaking with the assessor at Open Book, they can fill out an objection form at City Hall and make an appointment to appear before the Board of Review.

The **BOARD OF REVIEW** is scheduled to convene on **TUESDAY, JUNE 7th, 2022**, starting at 9:00 a.m. and will stay in session until 11:00 a.m. The Board will listen to evidence establishing the fair market value of the property only. Discussion on unrelated matters will not be heard.

Notice of the Board of Review City of Berlin

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Board of Review for the City of Berlin of Green Lake and Waushara Counties shall hold its first meeting on Tuesday, June 7th, 2022 from 9:00 a.m. to 11 a.m. at the Council Chambers of Berlin City Hall, 108 N. Capron Street.

Please be advised of the following requirements to appear before the Board of Review and procedural requirements if appearing before the Board:

1. No person will be allowed to appear before the Board of Review, to testify to the board by telephone or contest the amount of any assessment of real or personal property if the person has refused a reasonable written request by certified mail of the assessor to enter onto property to conduct an exterior view the property.
2. After the first meeting of the Board of Review and before the Board's final adjournment, no person who is scheduled to appear before the Board of Review may contact or provide information to a member of the Board about the persons' objection, except at a session of the Board. Open Book shall occur no less than 7 days prior to the Board of Review.
3. The board of review may not hear an objection to the amount or valuation of property unless, at least 48 hours before the board's first scheduled meeting, the objector provides to the board's clerk written or oral notice of an intent to file an objection, except that upon a showing of good cause and the submission of a written objection, the board shall waive that requirement during the first 2 hours of the board's first scheduled meeting, and the board may waive that requirement up to the end of the 5th day of the session or up to the end of the final day of the session if the session is less than 5 days with proof of extraordinary circumstances for failure to meet the 48-hour notice requirement and failure to appear before the board of review during the first 2 hours of the first schedule meeting.
4. Objections to the amount or valuation of property shall first be made in writing and filed with the clerk of the board of review within the first 2 hours of the board's first scheduled meeting, except that, upon evidence of extraordinary circumstances, the board may waive that requirement up to the end of the 5th day of the session or up to the end of the final day of the session if the session is less than 5 days. The board may require objections to the amount or valuation of property to be submitted on forms approved by the Department of Revenue, and the board shall require that any forms include stated valuations of the property in question. Persons who own land and improvements to that land may object to the aggregate valuation of that land and improvements to that land, but no person who owns land and improvements to that land may object only to the valuation of that land or only to the valuation of improvements to that land. No person may be allowed in any action or proceedings to question the amount or valuation of property unless the written objection has been filed and that person in good faith presented evidence to the board in support of the objection and made full disclosure before the board, under oath, of all of that person's property liable to assessment in the district and the value of that property. The requirement that objections be in writing may be waived by express action of the board.
5. When appearing before the board of review, the objecting person shall specify in writing the person's estimate of the value of the land and of the improvements that are the subject of the person's objection and specify the information that the person used to arrive at that estimate.

6. No person may appear before the board of review, testify to the board by telephone, or object to a valuation if that valuation was made by the assessor or the objector using the income method of valuation, unless the person supplies the assessor with all the information about income and expenses, as specified in the assessor's manual under s. 73.03 (2a), Wis. Stats., that the assessor requests. The City of Berlin has an ordinance for the confidentiality of information about income and expenses that is provided to the assessor under this paragraph that provides exceptions for persons using information in the discharge of duties imposed by law or the duties of their officer or by order of a court.* The information that is provided under this paragraph, unless a court determined that it is inaccurate, is not subject to the right of inspection and copying under s. 19.35(1), Wis. Stats.
7. The board shall hear upon oath, by telephone, all ill or disabled persons who present to the board a letter from a physician, surgeon, or osteopath that confirms their illness or disability. No other persons may testify by telephone unless the Board, in its discretion, has determined to grant a property owner's or their representative's request to testify under oath by telephone or written statement.
8. No person may appear before the board of review, testify to the board by telephone, or contest the amount of any assessment unless, at least 48 hours before the first meeting of the board, or at least 48 hours before the objection is heard if the objection is allowed under s. 70.47(3)(a), Wis. Stats., that person provides to the clerk of the board of review notice as to whether the person will ask for the removal of a member of the board of review and, if so, which member, and provides a reasonable estimate of the length of time the hearing will take.
