

On October 15, White Cane Safety Day is observed around the world. White Cane Safety Day celebrates the achievements of blind or visually impaired people. A white cane is an important mobility tool for such people as well as the symbol of their independence. Canes have been used by blind people for centuries, but the white cane was introduced in the early 20th century. Canes were painted white to be more easily visible.

As many of you already know, there have been security cameras installed in and around the Senior Center. This decision was made by Common Council with the support of Committee on Aging and myself. The cameras are here for protection, safety and security for not only the city but for the people that call the Senior Center their second home. If there is a fall, car accident, burglary, property damage or anything of that nature, the cameras will help determine the best course of action. The cameras are not monitored 24/7. In fact, there are no monitors at all. The cameras are ran using a computer program that can only be opened by the City Administrator. Footage on the cameras will only be looked at when the above scenarios occur. There is one audio camera located between Jill's office and the front door. This camera is also not being heard unless needed. It runs the exact same way as the video cameras. Council will be putting cameras in all the City buildings. Cameras are already in place in City Hall, the Police Station, the Aquatic Center, the Shelter Houses in Riverside Park and the Campground. Besides being in the City, cameras are part of life. They are at gas stations, grocery stores, convenient stores, businesses, personal resides, hospitals, traffic lights, gyms, and so many more locations. Having cameras at the Senior Center just puts the Center into a category of safety and security that I want all our patrons to have. I care deeply for this building and the people that visit it. I want to do everything I can to protect it. If you have any questions, please talk with me. Thank you, Becca.
