- First Tax Payment is DUE: Wednesday, January 31, 2024
- <u>Payments ON/BEFORE January 31, 2024</u>: Payable to City of Berlin Treasurer, 108 N. Capron St., Berlin WI 54923
 - Accepted tax bill payment methods: Cash or Check (no two-party checks) via mail, in-person, or drop box at City Hall.
 - If you require a receipt, <u>please include a self-addressed stamped envelope with your payment.</u> Please also include payment stub from Tax Bill or write Tax Bill number on check.
 - If you wish your payment to be posted in 2023, the payment MUST be received in person at the Clerk's Office by Friday, December 29 at <u>4:00 pm</u>, postmarked by December 31 OR dropped off in the City Hall Clerk's Department Dropbox located in front entrance of City Hall available 24/7 by December 31.
- <u>Payments AFTER January 31, 2024</u>: Payable to Green Lake County Treasurer, 571 County Road A, Green Lake WI 54941
 - Payment methods: Cash, Check, or Credit/Debit/Electronic Check (fees apply)
- LOTTERY CREDIT: If both installments on your tax bill are equal amounts, you are not getting the lottery credit. If the residence listed on your tax bill was your primary residence as of Jan 1, 2023 you may qualify for the lottery credit. Contact the Clerk's Office at 361-5400 for more information.
- Multiple Parcels can be combined into a single check; however, <u>parcels in different counties should</u> <u>NOT be combined.</u> ** For owners with properties in Green Lake and Waushara Counties, please send a <u>separate</u> check along with your payment stubs from your tax bills for each county.

Where do my tax dollars go?

The City of Berlin's elected officials and City staff are often asked how the City receives money and where the money is spent. We have put together the following page for a brief explanation of how operating funds are spent. We hope this explanation will help. Please know staff are always available to answer any additional questions you may have. You can also visit the city website at <u>www.cityofberlin.net</u> for more information.

Residents who own property in the City pay property taxes. The property tax bill adds together the tax levies of four different taxing jurisdictions. These taxing jurisdictions are the City of Berlin, the Berlin Area School District, Moraine Park Technical College, and either Green Lake or Waushara County (depending on which County you live in). Instead of requiring you to pay separate bills to each governmental unit, the levies from all four are combined into one bill for your convenience. After you pay your property tax bill, the money is divided and each taxing jurisdiction receives its share. Based on a home assessed value of \$100,000, the distribution of property taxes by jurisdiction can be found below (amounts taken from 2022 tax bill):

2024 Berlin Department of Public Works RESIDENTIAL SERVICES TIMELINE

PLEASE KEEP AND REFER TO IT ALL YEAR

The City of Berlin Department of Public Works (DPW) would like to remind residents of services provided starting in the Spring of each year. These services are in place to help homeowners keep their properties neat, clean and free of unnecessary debris.

NOTE: BUSINESSES AND MULTI FAMILY DWELLINGS OVER 4 UNITS WILL NOT RECEIVE SPRING CLEANUP SERVICES.

<u>1. SPRING ONLY BRUSH PICK-UP</u>: Weather permitting, the following is the schedule for Spring Brush Pick-Up:

Mon., May 6, 2024south of Broadway and west of the bridgeTues., May 7, 2024north of Broadway and west of the bridgeWed., May 8, 2024north of W. Huron, east of the bridge and west of N. WI StreetThurs., May 9, 2024north of E. Huron and east of N. Wisconsin StreetFri., May 10, 2024south of E. Huron and east of the bridge

Brush should be piled parallel with the curb with cut ends to your right as you face the street.

2. BULK ITEMS DROP OFF:

Residents will have the opportunity to dispose of bulk items by bringing them to Valley Trail Waste Management Landfill. Waste Management staff will confirm name and address before allowing residents to enter. Please bring proof of residency with you.

<u>LIST OF UNACCEPTABLE TRASH MATERIALS</u>: Batteries, major appliances, electronics, televisions, radios, cell phones, computers, computer accessories, waste oil, fluorescent lightbulbs, drywall, household or industrial waste, asbestos, machinery, tires, compost, auto parts, ashes or hot materials, ballasts, construction materials, or concrete.

<u>3. MAJOR APPLIANCE DISPOSAL</u>: Appliances such as freezers, refrigerators, dehumidifiers, microwaves and air conditioning units will be picked up during Spring Brush Pick-up week for a **NON-REFUNDABLE \$6.00 fee** per appliance, which is due in advance, payable at the City Clerk's Office.

<u>4. ELECTRONICS DISPOSAL</u>: May 4, 2024 at the City Garage, 241 Spring St. Hours are 8:00 am to 12:00 noon. This is the <u>ONLY</u> option to get rid of TV's. Price is per pound.

5. YARD WASTE & LEAF DISPOSAL: DPW collects loose leaves and grass clippings in the spring and fall of each year for residents. **The 2024 Spring Leaf Pickup will begin the week of April 15.** City crews will pick-up ONE TIME THROUGH THE CITY. Once your area has been picked-up, the DPW will not come back a second time. Leaves should be placed loose in the terrace only. DO NOT include sticks, twigs or branches and ABSOLUTELY NO GARBAGE, APPLIANCES, FURNITURE, TIRES, ETC.

<u>6. STORM DAMAGE PICK-UP</u>: The Public Works Superintendent will determine if there is a need for brush pick up after a storm.

<u>7. STUMP REMOVAL</u>: DPW has a stump removal program. If you register at City Hall by the <u>first Friday</u> in May, stumps in the terrace area <u>only</u> can be removed for \$100 per stump.

<u>8. BRUSH TRUCK RENTAL</u>: If you need alternative options to the scheduled pick-ups, the DPW also offers residents the option of renting a brush truck from the City Garage for large piles (fees do apply). You may contact City Hall at 920-361-5400 to schedule brush truck rental.

9. ELDERLY/HANDICAP TUESDAY MORNING PICKUP: The Tuesday morning pickup for Elderly and physically handicapped begins May 14 through October 11. Call 920-361-5425 the Monday before to schedule a Tuesday morning pickup. The Tuesday morning pickup is limited to small amounts of yard waste (an arm full).

10. CITY COMPOST SITE: *CITY OF BERLIN RESIDENTS ONLY* may also drop off leaves, grass, sticks, branches, garden waste and other organic *compostable waste* at the City of Berlin Compost Site located at White Ridge Rd. (Enter Berlin Conservation Club site and take a right at the first driveway.) NO GARBAGE, APPLIANCES, ELECTRONICS, FURNITURE OR TIRES. Violators will be fined.

Sign Up For CodeRED Emergency Alerts

What is CodeRED?

• CodeRED is an emergency notification service by which public safety can notify residents and businesses by telephone or cellular phone about emergency situations.

What kinds of situations will CodeRED be used for?

• Severe weather situations, substantial utility outage, evacuation notices, missing or lost persons, fires or floods, major roadway issues, significant criminal situations, chemical spills or gas leaks. CodeRED can be used for any emergency alert.
