The Nathan Strong gazebo history of Herman Stater's (local businessman who organized the first band to play at the gazebo) family will be visiting to honor a painting of such that was donated to the society.

The Inspiration Wall at the High School will have two new honorees (#40 & #41) added on November 9th at 2PM.

The antiques appraisal event, with appraiser Mark Moran, will be back in December in cooperation with the Library.
