MAYFLOWER TRIVIA

Two ships were originally scheduled to bring the group to America; the Speedwell and the Mayflower. The Speedwell developed leaks and the group had to turn back twice so it was decided to put all the passengers on the Mayflower. The ship finally left England on September 6, 1620. There were 102 passengers aboard and a crew of 30. A boy "Oceanus" was born during the voyage. Only one person died during the voyage. After traveling 2,750 miles at an average speed of 2 mph and after more than two months at sea, the Mayflower anchored in what is now Provincetown Harbor on November 11, 1620. Of the 102 passengers, only 29 are currently known to have descendants.
